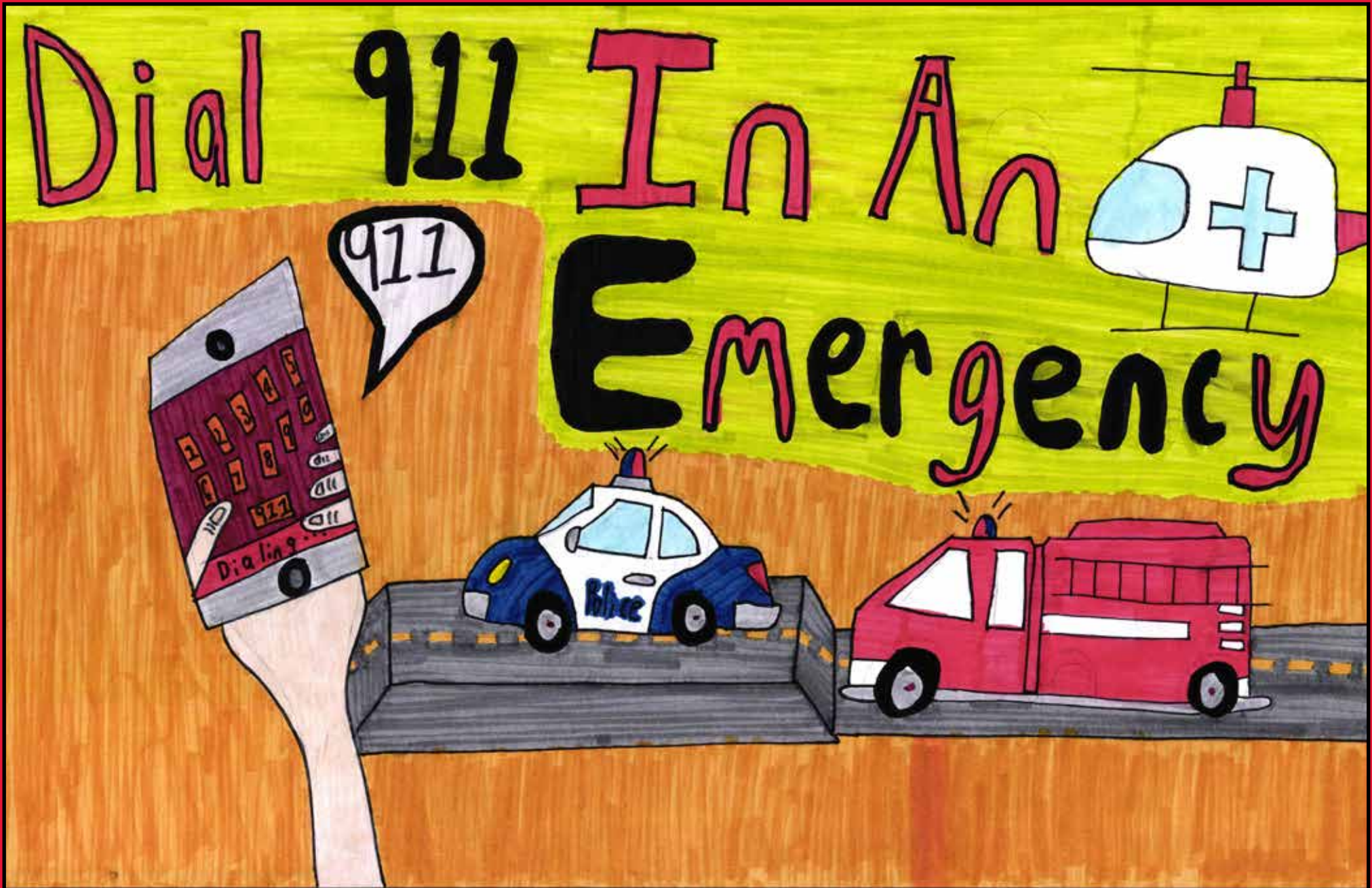

Enjoy the school year and be safe!

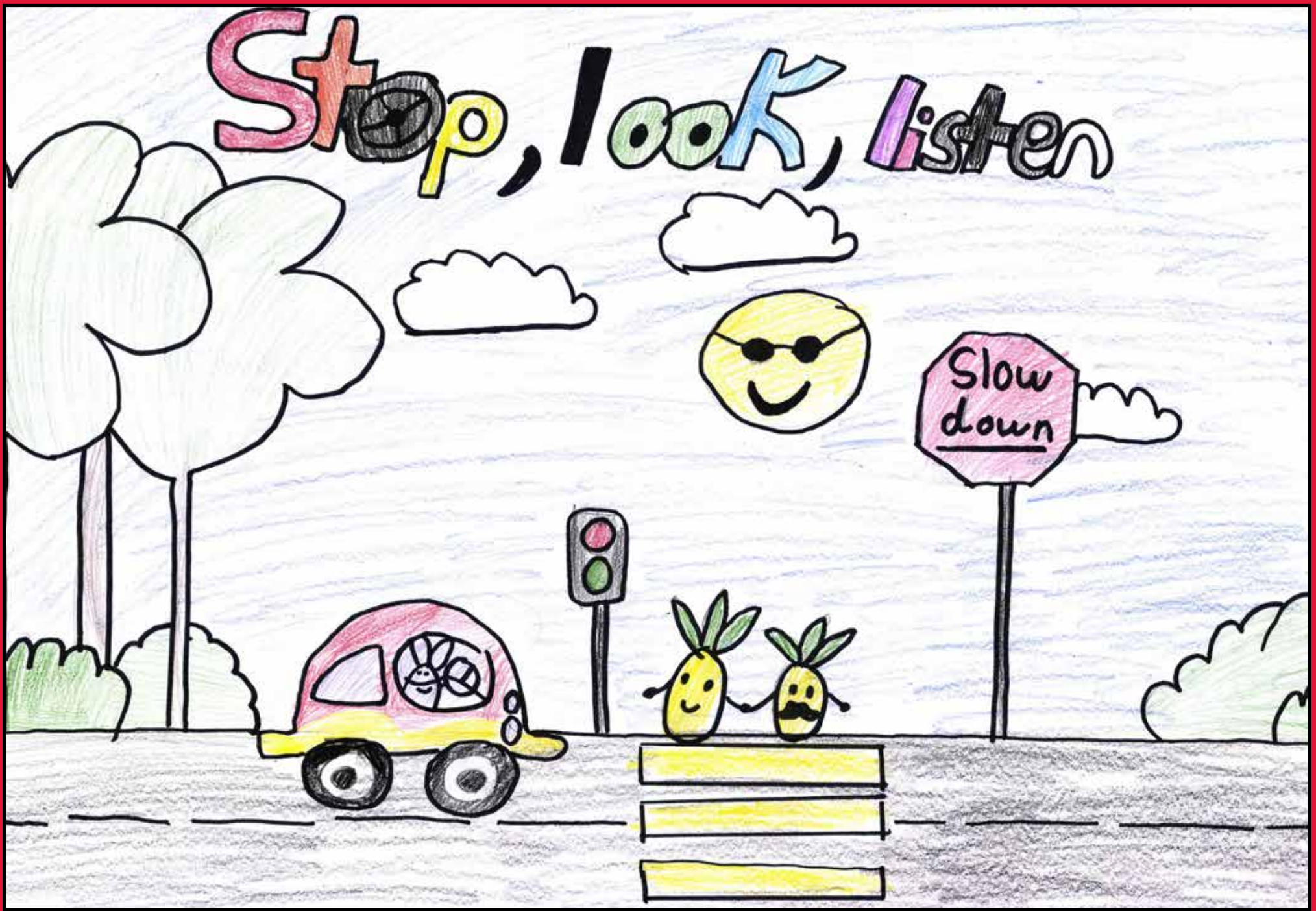
