7	<p><u>North Downtown Special Study Area.</u> Situated north of Benton Avenue, south of Douglas Avenue, between Washington and Webster Streets, this area has the potential to see redevelopment by 2030. The plan provides objectives for this area should it be redeveloped.</p>
