# NAPERVILLE'S "CROWN JEWEL"

The Naperville Riverwalk was created in 1981 to celebrate Naperville's Sesquicentennial (150<sup>th</sup> anniversary). The Riverwalk is acknowledged as one of the most beautiful places in the Midwest. Through the donation of volunteer time, money and materials, residents turned the once-forgotten riverfront into a beautiful linear park that has won state and national awards. The Park features covered bridges, relaxing fountains, stunning landscaping and distinctive shepherd's crook lights.

With 1.75 miles of walkway that meander along the DuPage River, the Riverwalk is located near various important, well-known places that are central to the community including the vibrant Downtown Naperville area. # COME VISIT THE RIVERWALK

Getting here is easy. The Riverwalk is close to the downtown Naperville Metra Station and several Pace bus routes that travel throughout the downtown area. Although no bicycles are allowed on the Riverwalk, bike racks are conveniently located at the Jefferson Avenue Gateway, Centennial Beach, the Park District Administration Building, adjacent to the Amphitheater, the Municipal Center and Fredenhagen Park.

# **Parking**

Free public parking lots are conveniently located adjacent to the Riverwalk and are displayed on the brochure map. Parking is restricted from 2:00-5:00 a.m. in all public parking lots. Real time parking availability is posted at all

entrances of both parking decks. For more information visit www.naperville.il.us/downtownparking.aspx.

# **Riverwalk Safety**

Except for strollers, mobility devices and authorized service vehicles, only foot traffic is permitted on the Riverwalk.

Bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates and all motorized vehicles are prohibited. Children should be kept away from the edge of lower walks, off of railings and away from waterway banks. Swimming is not permitted in the waterways along the Riverwalk. Use extra caution in inclement weather as the pavement can become slippery.

If you see any damage or suspicious activities at the Riverwalk or in any of our other parks, please call the Park Watch line at (630) 848-5050. In the event of an emergency, always dial 9-1-1.

### RIVERWALK POINTS OF INTEREST

#### **Grand Pavilion**

Located on the Riverwalk's west end, the Grand Pavilion is a large, covered structure that is used for picnics, Naperville Park District programs, walk-a-thons, and many other events. For more information, visit www.napervilleparks.org or call (630) 848-5000.

# **Jaycees Playground**

This well-loved, ADA-accessible playground offers fun for children of all ages and abilities. Playground amenities include Braille and sign language panels, climbers, wiggle ladder, centipede climber, slides, swings and more.

#### **Centennial Skate Park**

Although skating is not allowed on the Riverwalk itself, enthusiasts can test their inline skating or skateboarding skills at Centennial Skate Park, located adjacent to the Riverwalk and Centennial Beach. This free, unsupervised facility includes obstacles such as quarter-pipes, grinding rails and fun boxes. Visit www.napervilleparks.org for more information.

#### **Centennial Beach and Grill**



Centennial Beach is Naperville's historic "beach" that has been enjoyed by residents and visitors alike since 1931. Amenities include plenty of space for picnicking, zero-depth water entry with depths up to 15', a sand beach, water play features, diving board complex, slide and a sand volleyball court. Other highlights include updated locker rooms, family changing rooms, deck-level restrooms and lockers, an ADA platform lift and Centennial Grill, which offers a wide variety of food and beverage options. # Millennium Carillon in Moser Tower and Visitor Center

The Millennium Carillon in Moser
Tower was built to commemorate
the third millennium. The bell
tower stands 158 feet tall with 253
steps and 72 bells. The largest bell,
nicknamed "Big Joe" for Joseph
Naper, weighs in at six tons. Directly
adjacent to the tower is the Visitor



Center (formerly known as the Netzley House) where guests can learn about the Carillon and area history through interactive exhibits. Tickets to tour the tower are available for purchase at the Visitor Center. Visit www.napervilleparks.org and www.naperville-carillon.org for more information.

# **Rotary Hill**

Rotary Hill is host to many special events year-round such as the Last Fling and Millennium Carillon concerts. The hill also is popular in winter months as a favorite sledding spot. Rotary Hill is located near Aurora Avenue adjacent to the Millennium Carillon in Moser Tower.

# Riverwalk Eatery

Located near Rotary Hill, the Naperville Park District's Riverwalk Eatery is a convenient stop for a variety of food and snacks. Visit www.napervilleparks.org for menu and hours of operation.

# Paddleboat Quarry and Fishing Pier

Enjoy a Riverwalk paddleboat ride and explore part of the historic Naperville quarry. Four-person paddleboats are available for



rental on all non-school days from mid-May to mid-September.
Visit the Riverwalk Eatery for paddleboat rental information.

Additionally, fishing is permitted in the DuPage River and the Paddleboat Quarry. All State of Illinois regulations apply, including the requirement to have a valid fishing license for individuals age 16 and older. Permits can be purchased by calling (888) 6-PERMIT or online at www.dnr.illinois.gov.

#### **Shanower Memorial**

Inspired by Naval Commander Dan Shanower, a Naperville native who died in the Sept. 11, 2001 attack on America, this memorial was one of the first in the U.S. dedicated to lives



that were lost on that tragic day. The memorial includes more than 140 faces molded into a 48-foot retaining wall that were created by Naperville schoolchildren symbolizing the casualties on that day. An eternal flame also is present surrounded by a perennial garden.

# Riverwalk Amphitheater, Millennium Wall and Labyrinth

This open-tiered area can accommodate up to 100 people and is often used for community events and performances such as library-hosted family story hours. It also is a popular rentable space for outdoor weddings. Call (630) 848-5000

century. The Riverwalk Millennium Labyrinth is a replica of the Chartres Labyrinth in France and was designed to provide visitors with an opportunity to enjoy the twists and turns of this compact pathway.

#### **Dandelion Fountain**

Named for its shape, the Dandelion Fountain is surrounded by a picturesque scene of flowers and the nearby covered bridge, making it a perfect place to enjoy lunch or some quiet time. The fountain is located on Jackson Avenue at Webster Street.

# Exchange Club Veteran's Plaza

Located just east of the Dandelion
Fountain, this plaza is dedicated to
the men and women who have served
our country. A list honoring those
Napervillians who made the ultimate
sacrifice is located on the monument
in the center of the plaza.



# **Horse Trough Fountain (White Plaza)**

This large black basin, which is now a fountain at White Plaza off of Main Street, was once a horse trough at a downtown intersection during Naperville's early years.

# Fredenhagen Park

Located at Washington Street and the DuPage River,
Fredenhagen Park is the gateway to the east extension
of the Riverwalk. The land for the park was generously
donated in memory of Walter and Grace Fredenhagen
by their children. Located in Fredenhagen Park, the

# **Century Walk**

#### "Mr. And Mrs. Naperville"

This 7-foot tall bronze sculpture honors Margaret and Harold Moser who played a vital role in the growth and development of Naperville. The sculpture is located adjacent to the Millennium Carillon in Moser Tower.

#### "Dick Tracy"

This 9-foot tall bronze sculpture of Dick Tracy is dedicated to Dick Locher, a long-time Napervillian, who was one of the artists who wrote and drew the Dick Tracy comic strip.

#### "Riverwalk Visionaries"

This sculpture is a tribute to Jim Moser and former Mayor Chet Rybicki who were visionaries and the driving force behind the creation of the Riverwalk. It also celebrates the volunteer spirit that created this linear community park.



#### "A Lifetime Together"

This bronze sculpture is dedicated to Billy Sherer and Jane Latshaw Sherer, lifelong Napervillians who attended school, fell in love and spent the rest of their days in the town they adored. Wanting to give back to the community, they established an annual scholarship fund for two Naperville Central High School students.

#### "Two in a Million"

Located in Fredenhagen Park in honor of Walter and Grace Fredenhagen, this sculpture was created on property donated by their children, Rita and Ted. The bronze sculpture was installed in 2005.


