

#### **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

#### Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

#### PY 2020 Major Initiatives and Accomplishments:

**Entitlement Funds:** The City of Naperville received a total of \$537,062 in CDBG entitlement grant funds for PY 2020, plus \$30,691 in unspent prior year fund reallocated from other projects, for a total of \$567,753. These funds were allocated to the following major initiatives:\*

Affordable Rental Housing Rehabilitation – A total of \$179,265 in PY 2020 CDBG funds was allocated to two multi-family rehabilitation projects:

1) \$104,100 to a project to improve the living environment by improving security systems in an apartment building providing affordable, accessible housing to 27-31 low and moderate-income persons with severe physical disabilities. The project, which completed in the first quarter of PY 2021, replaced security cameras and door openers and closers with ADA-compliant keyless entry systems, and 2) \$75,165 to a project to restore outdoor living areas and landscaping that had to be removed in order to allow renovation of 122 units and construction of 62 new units at a multi-family apartment complex for low-income seniors. This project will be completed in the first quarter of PY 2021.

Homeless Housing and Supportive Services - A total of \$115,000 was allocated to two projects providing transitional housing and social services to approximately 35 homeless families (125 individuals) and 11-14 abused and/or neglected adolescents: 1) \$100,000 will be used to replace windows and patio doors at six transitional housing multi-family buildings, and 2) \$15,000 to replace the roof at one single-family group home. Both projects recently got underway.

**Non-Housing Community Development Needs: Homelessness** - A total of \$80,570 was allocated to two public service activities to prevent homelessness: 1) \$65,320 to provide emergency rent and utility assistance to approximately 300 persons at risk of homelessness, and 2) \$15,250 to provide onsite social service assistance to approximately 18 formerly homeless persons living in supportive housing. Both projects are currently underway.

**Non-Housing Community Development Needs: Public Facilities** - A total of \$50,000 was allocated to replace fluorescent lighting fixtures at a food collection and distribution center with energy-efficient LED bulbs and fixtures. The facility is the primary source of food provided to

Naperville food pantries. The project was completed in the first quarter of PY 2021.

Special Needs Housing and Supportive Services - A total of \$87,000 was allocated to rehabilitate kitchens and bathrooms at two group homes, owned by a single subrecipient agency, providing housing and services to eight adults with severe physical and mental disabilities. This project is scheduled to begin in the second quarter of PY2021.

#### **CARES Act Funds:**

CARES Act funds were allocated in two rounds: CV 1, announced in April, 2020, resulted in an allocation of \$315,985, supplemented by \$81,000 in reprogrammed PY 2018 entitlement funds, and CV 3, an additional \$708,723 announced in September, 2020, for a total of \$1,024,708. During April-May, 2020, the City conducted a survey and interviews with social service agencies, local governments, business organizations and other stakeholders to determine priorities for distribution of CARES Act funding, with <u>all funds used to prevent, prepare for or respond to the COVID-</u>

<u>19 pandemic</u>. Based on these interviews, the following priorities and investments were adopted for CV 1 funding. Following adoption of the priorities, funds for Public Services and Public Facilities were distributed to residents by subrecipients chosen through a competitive application process. For CV 3 funds, the original awards reevaluated and supplemented, where staff determining an ongoing need was present:

Public Services – Program assistance to individuals, households and businesses directly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Shelter Up to 6 months of rent/mortgage/utility assistance to households, CV 1: \$50,000, CV 3: \$50,000
- Shelter Motel/hotel expenses for homeless persons and domestic violence victims, CV 1: \$50,000, CV 3: \$150,000
- Food Meal preparation and delivery to seniors, people with disabilities and low- and moderate-income residents, CV 1: \$60,000, CV 3: \$60,000
- Other Public Services
  - Employment/job counseling services for homeless persons, CV 1: \$25,854, CV 3: \$58,723
  - Mental health services for seniors, CV 1: \$50,505, CV 3: \$50,000
  - Housing: Reimbursement to agencies providing housing for homeless persons and adults with disabilities, CV 1: \$30,000 to compensate for increased staffing costs to provide added mental health/wellbeing services to residents, CV 3: \$100,000 for motel/hotel and costs to provide job training and educational services to homeless youths experiencing unemployment/underemployment due to the COVID-19 pandemic

**Public Facilities** – CV 1: \$30,626 to an agency providing transitional housing for homeless families to reduce the digital divide and facilitate elearning and working/job search from home by upgrading internet/wifi services for residents.

**Economic Development** - Direct assistance to small businesses through a competitive application process to enable job creation/job retention and help for microbusinesses, CV 1: \$100,000 and CV 3: 240,000 (28 grants awarded by March 31, 2021 @ \$5,000 each; an additional 20 grants were disbursed during the first quarter of PY 2021).

By the end of PY 2020, all above programs were underway, with \$250,985.58 expended (CARES Act Funds: \$174,985.58, Reprogrammed PY 2018 Entitlement Grant Funds: \$76,000).

Assess how the jurisdiction's use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

Entitlement Funds: Naperville's CDBG projects have emphasized preservation and rehabilitation of existing affordable units, both owner and

renter occupied. The City has focused the most resources on rental housing, through both and rehabilitation and acquisition, where feasible, since the majority of low and moderate-income residents are renters. The City has also provided significant support to homelessness prevention, transitional housing rehabilitation and public services for people in both emergency housing and supportive as these residents are most likely to be living in poverty or in danger of poverty.

The City has also given high priority to assisting residents with special needs, both by supporting special needs housing rehabilitation and acquisition, services for people with special needs and eliminating architectural barriers in public facilities.

#### **PY 2020 Goals Versus Outcomes**

Program Year 2020 was the first year of the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan. Projects funded by the City of Naperville for PY 2020 focused on five of the eight goals outlined in the City's Strategic Plan: affordable rental housing, homeless housing and supportive services, special needs housing and supportive services, non-housing community development: homelessness prevention and non-housing community development: public facilities. The COVID-19 pandemic seriously impacted the completion of this projects in three ways:

- 1) Funding Delays: Although the Naperville City Council initially approved the PY 2020 Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan on March 17, 2020, the City and its HOME Consortium Lead Agency, the DuPage County Community Development Commission, agreed to delay submission of the plan to better assess the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on PY 2020 priorities and funding levels. Although the City of Naperville maintained the same funding priorities and awards originally outlined in the Annual Action Plan, several changes were made to the Consolidated Plan to reflect the impact of the pandemic and permit funding for projects the City had previously not funded, such as small business assistance programs. The revised Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan was approved by City Council on July 21, 2020 and submitted to HUD by DuPage County on August 9, 2020. The City executed its PY 2020 Funding Agreement on September 8, 2020.
- 2) **Vulnerable Populations:** Several of the projects approved by the City involved improvements to housing serving populations at higher risk of vulnerability to COVID-19: severely disabled adults, senior citizens and persons living in group residences. The need to take special precautions with these populations resulted in several projects being delayed, rescheduled or amended.
- 3) **Need to Prioritize CARES Act Funding:** As described above, the City received \$1,024,723 in CARES Act funding in addition to the \$537,062 in entitlement grant funding. The City prioritized the CARES Act expenditures, requiring the development of new application,

review and disbursement processes while working with additional subrecipients.

Despite these hurdles, all PY 2020 entitlement grant programs were completed by the first quarter of PY 2021 or are anticipated to be completed in PY 2021. With one exception, CARES Act programs are also expected to be completed during PY 2021. Once all projects are complete, the it is anticipated that the City will exceed its goals in all areas.

#### Narrative

Entitlement Funds - Families Assisted by Racial/Ethnic Composition: Loaves & Fishes CARES program was the only PY 2020 entitlement grant-funded program to be fully completed by the end of the program year (March 31, 2021). The CARES program is a public service activity that provides emergency rent/mortgage and utility assistance to residents experiencing financial difficulties.

As shown in Table 2, a total of 71 or 43.8% of the 162 persons assisted were African-American, 67 or 41.4% were white, 17 or 10.5% were Other/Multi-Racial and 7 or 4.3% were Asian. Hispanics of all races made up 42 or 25.9% of persons assisted. This likely reflects differences in median family incomes for households belonging to different racial/ethnic groups in DuPage and Will County.

In addition to the Loaves & Fishes CARES Program, one PY 2018 and four PY 2019 capital improvement projects were fully completed in PY 2020. These projects and data on racial/ethnic composition of persons assisted are shown below:

Martin Avenue Apartments (PY 2018): Capital improvements to affordable apartments for low-income seniors - Of 122 persons assisted, approximately 83% were White, 7% were African-American and 10% were Asian. Hispanics of all races were approximately 5% of all persons assisted. These statistics likely reflect the overall racial/ethnic composition of senior citizens in DuPage and Will County.

**Bridge Communities Transitional Housing Apartments:** Capital improvements to affordable transitional housing apartments for homeless families – Of 101 people assisted, approximately 50% were White, 43% were African-American, 5% were Asian and 3% were Other/Multi-Racial. Hispanics of all races were approximately 22% of all persons assisted. These outcomes are similar to those for Loaves & Fishes CARES Program and also reflect differences in median family incomes for households belonging to different racial/ethnic groups in DuPage and Will County.

**Illinois Independent Living Center:** Capital improvements to affordable apartments for low-income adults with physical disabilities. Of 29 persons assisted, approximately 79% were White, 10% were African-American, 3% were Asian and 7% were Other/Multi-Racial. Hispanics of all races were approximately 3% of all persons assisted. These statistics likely reflect the overall racial/ethnic composition of senior citizens in DuPage and Will County.

Ray Graham Association and UCP Seguin: Capital improvements to affordable apartments for low-income adults with physical disabilities. Of 29 persons assisted, approximately 79% were White, 10% were African-American, 3% were Asian and 7% were Other/Multi-Racial. Hispanics of all races were approximately 3% of all persons assisted. These statistics likely reflect the overall racial/ethnic composition of senior citizens in DuPage and Will County.

CARES Act Funds - Families Assisted by Racial/Ethnic Composition: All CARES Act programs are currently in process, though Loaves & Fishes Emergency Financial Assistance Program has reported statistics on racial/ethnic composition of beneficiaries for its initial allocation of \$50,000. This program is essentially the same as the Loaves & Fishes CARES Program, providing rent/mortgage and utility assistance to families experiencing financial instability directly attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic (job loss, reduction in hours, extended illness, etc.). As of March 31, 2021, the Emergency Financial Assistance Program had assisted 88 people, of whom 41 or 46.6% were White, 33 or 37.5% were African American, 4 or 4.5% were Asian and 10 or 11.4% were Other/Multi-Racial. Hispanics of all races made up 24 or 27.3% of persons assisted. Therefore, the percentage of Whites was somewhat higher in the COVID-related program than in the ongoing CARES Program.

#### **Narrative**

#### **Resources Made Available**

**Entitlement Funds**: In PY 2020, Naperville initially received a CDBG Entitlement Grant of \$537,144 to fund PY 2020 CDBG projects. The allocation was later reduced to \$537,062 due to a calculation error by HUD in determining the original allocation amount. In addition, the \$30,691 in prior year unspent funds was also included in available funding for PY 2020 projects, for a total of \$567,753. No program income was received during PY 2020.

CARES Act, passed by Congress in March, 2020, to address the COVID-19 pandemic. The funds were were subject to a stipulation that they be used <u>only</u> for projects designed to "prevent, prepare for and respond to the Coronavirus (COVID-19)." At least 70 percent of funds were required to be used for activities that benefit low- and moderate-income persons by providing housing, a permanent job, a public service, or access to new or significantly improved infrastructure. The remaining 30 percent could be used to eliminate slum or blighted conditions, or to address an urgent need the City was unable to fund through other means.

The initial allocation of \$315,985, announced in April, 2020, was followed by a second allocation of \$708,723, announced in September, 2020, for a total of \$1,024,708. The City supplemented the first allocations with an additional \$81,000 in PY 2018 funds available from two cancelled projects, resulting in a total of \$1,105,708 for projects to address the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **Investments**

**PY 2020 Projects – Entitlement Funds:** \$114,589.39 in CDBG entitlement funds was spent on three PY 2020 activities during PY 2020, including \$88,011.73 in PY 2020 entitlement funds and \$26,577.66 in unexpended funds from PY 2016, PY 2017 and PY2018. The three PY 2020 activities were:

- **DuPage PADS Olympus Place Supportive Housing Program:** \$10,749.93 in PY 2020 entitlement funds was spent on the Olympus Place Supportive Housing Program, a public service program providing social service assistance to formerly chronically homeless people.
- Loaves & Fishes Emergency Financial Assistance Program (non-COVID): \$52,034.80 in PY 2020 entitlement funds was spent to provide rent and utility assistance to people experiencing financial need not related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• City of Naperville Grant Administration and Planning Costs: \$15,525.78 in PY 2020 entitlement funds, \$1,393.71 in unexpended PY 2016 entitlement funds, \$23,928.57 in unexpended PY 2017 entitlement funds and \$1,265.38 in unexpended PY 2018 entitlement funds was spent on PY 2020 grant administration and planning costs for the CDBG program.

Final reimbursement for all three projects will be completed in the first quarter of PY 2021.

**PY 2020 Projects – CARES Act Funds:** \$250,985.58 was spent on four programs to prevent, prepare for and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic during PY 2020, including \$174,985.58 in CARES Act funds and \$76,000 in reprogrammed PY 2018 entitlement funds. The four PY 2020 activities were:

- **DuPage PADS Emergency Temporary Housing Program for Individuals and Families:** \$50,000.00 in CARES Act funds was spent to assist DuPage PADS to temporarily house homeless people in hotels and motels due to closure of shelters due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This program is ongoing with an additional \$150,000.00 available to be spent in PY 2021.
- Loaves & Fishes Emergency Financial Assistance Program (COVID-related): \$45,735.29 in CARES Act funds was spent to provide rent and utility assistance to people experiencing financial need due to job loss, reduction in hours and health concerns due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This program is ongoing and is expected to be completed in PY 2021.
- Loaves & Fishes Emergency Food Assistance Program: \$15,250.29 in CARES Act funds was spent to provide emergency food assistance to elderly persons and low-income households who experienced increased need due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This program is ongoing and is expected to be completed in PY 2021.
- Small Business Assistance Grant (SBAG) Program: \$140,000.00, including \$64,000.00 in CARES Act funds and \$76,000.00 in reprogrammed PY 2018 entitlement grant funds, was spent to provide \$5,000.00 grants to assist small businesses experiencing a decline in profits and revenue due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. This program will be completed in the first quarter of PY 2021.

Five additional COVID-19 programs will seek reimbursement in PY 2021. These programs are directed at mental health care, housing homeless youth, job training for homeless persons, assisting group homes to address the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and improvements to internet and wifi service for people living in transitional housing and using these services for education and employment.

**Non-PY 2020 Projects – Entitlement Funds:** Most PY 2020 entitlement-funded projects expected to begin in PY 2020 were delayed due to the pandemic, as were several PY 2019 and 2018 projects that had been expected to conclude during PY 2020. However, several prior year projects were able to move forward. A total of \$348,196.92 was spent on PY 2019 and 2018 projects, including the following:

• **PY 2019:** \$235,959.52 in entitlement funds was spent to complete four PY 2019 projects, including \$212,340.00 in PY 2019 entitlement funds, \$4,958.00 in unexpended PY 2017 entitlement funds and \$18,661.52 in unexpended PY 2016 entitlement funds. Projects included emergency financial assistance public services, two rehabilitation projects for multi-family buildings providing housing for persons with disabilities and transitional housing for homeless

- families, two rehabilitation projects for group homes providing housing for people with disabilities and planning and administration for PY 2019 CDBG funds.
- **PY 2018:** \$112,237.40 in PY 2018 entitlement funds was spent to complete three PY 2018 projects, including one multi-family rehabilitation project for low-income seniors, one group home rehabilitation project and a planning workshop on affordable housing.

Attachments 1, 2 and 3, located at the end of this report, provide complete information on all funds expended for PY 2020, 2019 and 2018 projects during PY 2020, as well as outcomes for individual activities.

#### **Narrative**

All PY 2020 projects, except for one, are located within the incorporated boundaries of the City of Naperville and will be used to benefit exclusively Naperville residents. This project not located in Naperville provided rehabilitation funding to a food collection and distribution center that provides food to food banks in Naperville for Naperville residents.

The city did not target specific neighborhoods or residents of specific neighborhoods for investments or services.

#### Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

- *Matching Requirements:* None of the projects completed during the program year were subject to matching requirements.
- **Publicly Owned Land or Property:** No PY 2020 projects or any projects completed in PY 2020 involved publicly owned land or property.
- Leveraging Additional Resources: Funded projects from all years leveraged \$713,772 in CDBG funds with over \$1,000,000 from a variety of funding sources provided by subrecipients to successfully conduct their projects. These funding sources included unrestricted agency funds, bank loans, donations, grants and fundraisers. All project management activities needed to complete the projects, including procurement, supervision, accounting, income verification and preparing reports, were carried out by staff of the subrecipient agencies.

### Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The affordable housing goals shown above represent goals included in the PY 2020 Annual Action Plan and affordable housing activities that were completed during PY 2020 (April 1, 2020 – March 31, 2021). A total of 6 affordable housing projects were funded with entitlement funds –

- 2 special needs housing (group home/CILA) rehabilitation activities: Kids Above All (formerly ChildServ) Roof Replacement and Ray Graham Association Kitchen/Bathroom Rehabilitation;
- 1 transitional housing rehabilitation activitities: Bridge Communities Transitional Housing Window/Door Replacement;
- 2 owner/rental housing multi-family rehabilitation activities: Illinois Independent Living Center Katharine Manor Apartments Security System Upgrade (both owners and renters) and

- Naperville Elderly Homes Martin Avenue Apartments Landscape Restoration Project (senior renter households)
- 1 homelessness prevention emergency financial assistance activity Loaves and Fishes CARES Program

All of these projects were underway by the end of the program year, though none were fully completed by March 31, 2021. As discussed in *Section CR-05, Goals and Outcomes*, the COVID-19 pandemic caused three serious delays in project implementation: 1) Submission of the PY 2020 Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan was delayed until July, 2020 to accommodate DuPage County's need to assess how projects would be impacted by the pandemic – this caused PY 2020 projects to miss the 2020 construction season, 2) Subrecipients whose residents included vulnerable populations – people with disabilities and seniors – delayed or amended project to address health concerns, and 3) Implementation of CARES Act programs necessarily took time away from non-COVID projects. Nevertheless, six prior year projects - addressing rehabilitation of multi-family housing, transitional housing and group homes; and homelessness prevention assistance – were completed, providing assistance to approximately 600 low and moderate-income persons.

#### Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

PY 2020 projects, the first year of the PY 2020 – PY 2024 Consolidated Plan, emphasized preservation and rehabilitation of existing affordable units, primarily rental units, occupied by vulnerable low and moderate income populations – homeless persons, persons with disabilities and seniors. Projects approved in succeeding years of this Consolidated Plan will continue to emphasize affordable rental housing preservation and rehabilitation, as affordable rental units are the primary means of housing low-income households. The City will continue to support affordable housing for special needs households, and the development of transitional housing and permanent supportive housing for formerly homeless individuals. Increased emphasis will be placed on housing preservation through rehabilitation for low and moderate-income homeowners and development of new affordable units and acquisitions of affordable units, where feasible.

During PY 2020, the City began implementation of the HOMES Housing Action Plan, a pro-bono technical assistance project undertaken with help from the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus, Metropolitan Planning Council and CMAP, and the Housing Needs Assessment/Affordable Housing Plan recommended by the City's Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI). The findings and recommendations of the two studies were used to prepare the PY 2020 – PY 2024 Consolidated Plan. In January, 2021, the City Council adopted several recommendations included in the Housing Needs Assessment/Affordable Housing Plan:

- Develop Specific Plan to Preserve Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH);
- 2. Establish a Revolving Rehabilitation Loan Fund specifically targeted towards low income seniors who currently own in Naperville so that they can make the necessary repairs to their home and age in place;

3. Conduct a Study on Feasibility of Implementing an Inclusionary Zoning Ordinance (IZO).

A total of \$73,450 in CDBG funding has been allocated to Recommendation #2, the Single-Family Home Repair Program (PY 2018 Entitlement Funds - \$41,750; PY 2021 Entitlement Funds - \$31,750).

In PY 2020, the City also continued to implement the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI) Action Items. For PY 2021, this will result in approximately \$12,000 in CDBG funds allocated to a Paired Real Estate Testing Study to assess racial/ethnic/disability/source of income discrimination in the rental housing market.

#### **Narrative Information**

Although only one PY 2020 activity, Loaves & Fishes CARES Program, was completed by the end of the program year (March 31, 2021), one other public service activity requested reimbursement and provided information on beneficiaries – DuPage PADS Olympus Place Supportive Housing provides supportive services to residents of the Olympus Place supportive housing apartments - 11 households, comprising 21 persons, were assisted. All of those assisted were extremely low-income. In addition, 162 people were assisted by Loaves & Fishes CARES program providing emergency rent and utility assistance to prevent homelessness. Of these households, approximately 71% were extremely low-income, 19% were low-income, 8% were moderate-income and only about 2% were above moderate-income.

Overall, approximately 75% of the persons assisted by the two programs were extremely low-income, 16% were low-income, 7% were moderate-income and 2% were above moderate-income. Therefore, approximately 95% of the households that received assistance from these two program were low- or moderate-income. These results significantly exceed the statutory requirement that at least 70% of CDBG funds be used to benefit low-and moderate-income persons.

# CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c) Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:

### Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Outreach to homeless and at-risk residents in Naperville is challenging, because there are relatively few visibly homeless or unsheltered people. Homelessness prevention and other emergency assistance services are crucial in reducing homelessness, both because they provide cash and other assistance and because of the opportunities they present to assess the needs of these individuals and refer them to appropriate services.

In PY 2020, the City of Naperville allocated \$65,320 in CDBG funds, supplemented by local Social Services Grant (SSG) funds, to Loaves & Fishes CARES Program's Emergency Financial Assistance homelessness prevention program. Other programs, including social services to persons in emergency housing, were assisted through the City's SSG Program. All projects that provide either homelessness prevention services or housing for people who are already homeless also provide supportive services designed to prevent future crises and episodes of homelessness. Social services agencies that provide assistance to very low-income and homeless people, including food assistance, mental health assistance and assistance to homeless youth, either conduct their own individual needs assessments or provide referrals to other agencies.

#### Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

A total of \$115,000 in PY 2020 CDBG funds were allocated to two transitional housing programs: \$100,000 to Bridge Communities, Inc. for rehabilitation projects at six apartment buildings providing transitional housing to approximately 35 families and \$15,000 to ChildServ (Kids Over All) to fund capital improvements for a group residence for abused and neglected teen girls.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The DuPage County Continuum of Care (COC) emphasizes homelessness prevention through providing a comprehensive array of services that begin by "preventing homelessness whenever possible and end with ensuring every resident.... has their basic needs of food, clothing, and housing met along with

achieving their maximum level of self-sufficiency."

In addition to entitlement funds, a significant portion of the City"s CARES Act funds were used to respond to homelessness issues created by the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic caused traditional homeless shelters to close due to concerns about contagion and the inability to social distance. Homeless assistance organizations, such as DuPage PADS, were forced to house homeless people in hotels and motels at significantly greater expense. For this reason, the City allocated a total of \$200,000 in CARES Act funds to assist DuPage PADS to pay these additional expenses. The City also allocated \$84,577 to perovide job counseling and training to assist homeless people to find work during the pandemic. Another \$100,000 was allocated to 360 Youth Services to provide education/employment training to homeless youths affected by the pandemic. Finally, a total of \$100,000 was allocated to Loaves & Fishes homelessness prevention program to provide rent, mortgage and utility assistance to households in financial crisis due to unemployment/underemployment or illiness due to the pandemic. Together, these programs accounted for over 47% of CARES Act funding.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

The **DuPage PADS** - **Olympus Place Supportive Housing Program** received \$15,250 PY 2020 entitlement grant funds in public service funding to DuPage PADS to support the salaries of staff providing social service assistance to formerly chronically homeless people living at Olympus Place, a supportive housing apartment complex designed to allow formerly chronically homeless people to live independently.

Ther 360 Youth Services Program described above, is designed specifically to responde to the needs of homeless youth during the pandemic.

#### CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

#### Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

There were no traditional public housing developments located in Naperville during Program Year 2020 and none are currently planned.

The City of Naperville is divided between DuPage County and Will County. DuPage County residents are served by the DuPage Housing Authority and Will County residents are served by the Housing Authority of Joliet. The DuPage Housing Authority does provide project-based vouchers to residents in some income-restricted complexes, but does not own or operate these buildings.

# Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

At this time, the DuPage Housing Authority's programs are limited to the Housing Choice Voucher Program, State of Illinois Rental Housing Support Program and Senior Housing. The housing voucher program in Will County is operated by the Housing Authority of Joliet. As mentioned above, there are no public housing developments in Naperville.

#### Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The City of Naperville is served by the DuPage Housing Authority and Housing Authority of Joliet. Neither of these agencies are considered "troubled" PHA's.

#### CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

Barriers to affordable housing include a lack of affordable land for new construction, failure to include affordable units in new developments that are built, and a lack of complete understanding of how public policies involving land development impact affordable housing.

In PY March, 2020, the City completed a Housing Needs Assessment/Affordable Housing Plan developed by a consultant, SB Friedman Development Advisors, under the auspices of the City's Housing Advisory Commission (now the Human Rights and Fair Housing Commission). The Commission recommended eight of 22 recommendations to the Naperville City Council for immediate adoption. The City sponsored a workshop on the recommendations and adopted a Work Plan in January, 2021, highlighting three items for implementation by the end of the year:

- 1. Develop Specific Plan to Preserve Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH);
- 2. Establish a Revolving Rehabilitation Loan Fund specifically targeted towards low income seniors who currently own in Naperville so that they can make the necessary repairs to their home and age in place;
- 3. Conduct a Study on Feasibility of Implementing an Inclusionary Zoning Ordinance (IZO).

The Human Rights and Fair Housing Commission also voted to further implement the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI) by hiring a consultant to conduct a Paired Real Estate Testing Sutdy to assess discrimination in the rental housing market. PY 2021 CDBG funds have been allocated for this study.

#### Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Three obstacles have been identified to meeting underserved needs:

- Lack of public understanding of the existence and needs of underserved population groups
- Lack of focus on providing the resources needed to address underserved needs
- Lack of awareness by persons in need of support about resources that are available

The recent housing studies have increased understanding of the demographic and socio-economic characteristics of underserved populations and their housing and social service needs.

CARES Act expenditures were designed specifically to address underserved needs arising from the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City of Naperville experiences relatively few incidents of lead poisoning due to the large volume of newer housing in the City and effective regulations that address this issue. The Illinois Department of Public Health – Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program has primary responsibility for the education and screening activities relating to lead hazards. They provide four types of services described below and will continue to provide these services.

#### **Public Information**

The Illinois Department of Public Health provides information to the public about the dangers of lead poisoning and how residents can address the issues in their own homes. Flyers are provided on request and distributed through its Childhood Lead Prevention program

#### Testing for Lead Hazards in the Home

Testing is done in cases where a lead hazard is suspected, or when a child's blood level meets the threshold to require the environmental testing.

#### Screening for Elevated Blood Levels

Where tests produce evidence of children being exposed to lead hazards, the Illinois Department of Public Health will screen children for lead poisoning.

#### Counseling

When lead hazards are present or when there are positive tests for lead poisoning, counseling for the family is made available.

#### **Actions Taken**

Planning to meet the cost of lead-based services is difficult since there is no realistic way to anticipate the full need or cost of any repair that occurs based on testing. DuPage County and the City provide reference materials and information to people who believe they may have exposure to lead paint as part of their projects. In PY 2019, there were no projects that required lead paint testing or abatement.

#### **Compliance and Monitoring**

The City has implemented policies to ensure that the CDBG program is in full compliance with the lead-based paint hazards. The age of the structures where work will be performed is verified before the project starts. Work on structures built before 1978 is required to comply with regulations and take appropriate steps to conduct remediation or follow Safe Housing Rule.

#### Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Naperville's estimated poverty rate in 2020 was approximately 4.41% (U.S. Census, Quick Facts). However, this rate still represents more than a 100 percent increase since 2000, a period when the population as a whole increased by about 12.6 percent. With these statistics in mind, the City targeted its anti-poverty efforts towards its most vulnerable populations - homeless households, persons at risk of homelessness, formerly homeless people in need of supportive housing, and extremely low-income households and households in crisis. At this time, the long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is still unknown, though the City will carefully monitor these effects going forward and make adjustments in funding priorities accordingly.

In addition to CDBG funding, The City also allocated \$500,000 in General Fund revenue to the Social Services Grant (SSG) Program. This program provides financial assistance to not-for-profit social service agencies that serve the needs identified in the Consolidated Plan. Funded programs were designed to promote self-sufficiency, assist families in crisis and provide resources for underserved groups, including senior citizens, persons with disabilities and youth.

Actions undertaken in PY 2020 include the following:

- Homelessness Prevention: Loaves & Fishes CARES Program was awarded \$65,320 in PY 2020 CDBG funding for an Emergency Financial Assistance Program to provide emergency rent and utility assistance to prevent evictions and utility shutoffs. Loaves & Fishes was also awarded \$100,000 in CARES Act funds specifically to address the need of people at-risk of homelessness due to illness or pandemic-related job loss and underemployment.
- *Transitional Housing:* \$115,000 in PY 2020 CDBG funds were awarded programs providing transitional housing for abused and/or neglected adolescents and families. Although neither of these projects were completed during PY 2020, both are underway and will be completed during PY 2021.
- **Permanent Supportive Housing:** DuPage PADS' Olympus Place Supportive Housing Program was awarded \$15,250 in PY 2020 CDBG funds to provide social services to chronically homeless people rehoused in an independent supportive housing apartment complex.
- Low-Income Housing Preservation: A total of \$104,100 in PY 2020 CDBG funds was awarded to rehabilitate affordable and accessible housing for adults with severe physical disabilities. Another \$87,000 in PY 2020 CDBG funds was awarded to provide capital improvements to group homes and CILA's for people with developmental disabilities.
- *Employment Assistance:* DuPage PADS was awarded a total of \$84,577 to provide employment counseling/job training to persons experiencing homelessness due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City consults with local housing and social service agencies to eliminate gaps in services, reduce duplication of programs, and emphasize efficient service delivery for local, state, and federal programs.

The City granted \$500,000 from its General Fund to fund social service projects that met the City's funding priorities. This program provides both the City and social service agencies with greater financial flexibility to fund public service projects. The City can spend more to support social services, while reserving CDBG funds for capital projects.

The City also participated in the DuPage County HOME Advisory Commission to learn and provide advice on how affordable housing programs are implemented county-wide.

# Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City of Naperville is a member of the DuPage County Consortium and the HOME Advisory Council. The DuPage County Consortium coordinates the efforts of county-wide networks and coalitions by providing leadership; identifying priority needs, strategies, and funding opportunities; analyzing performance; and sharing knowledge with service providers, including the DuPage County Continuum of Care.

### Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

In PY 2016, City staff worked with a consultant to develop a new Analysis of Impediments to Fair to Housing Choice (AI), which was accepted by the City in May, 2017. The Housing Advisory Commission (HAC) has been tasked with implementing the recommendations of this study, including conducting an annual progress review and setting implementation priorities.

The AI also recommended that the City develop an affordable housing plan and take steps to better integrate housing into the planning process. As previously discussed under *CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)*, the City has undertaken several actions to address this goal, including adopting an Affordable Housing Work Plan to provide homeowner rehabilitation, preserve existing affordable housing and consider adopting an Inclusionary Zoning Ordinance. In PY 2021, the City will engage a consultant to conduct a paired real estate testing study to assess discrimination in the rental housing market.

#### CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

All of the City's subrecipients are monitored throughout the program year, though on-site monitoring did not take place in PY 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to project approval, subrecipients are required to submit documentation demonstrating their capacity to manage and complete the project, completeness of their standard procedures, financial soundness, ability to document compliance with a National Objective, and compliance with the Civil Rights Act, EEO, ADA and other federal laws and regulations.

Subrecipients file quarterly reports detailing progress in completing projects. Reports are reviewed by the CDBG coordinator. Issues and questions arising from the reports are discussed with the subrecipient agency and adjustments in procedures are made where necessary. This practice facilitates clear communication between grantee and subrecipient and allows areas of concern to be addressed in a timely manner. In addition, regular communication with subrecipients is maintained throughout the year to check on progress and to answer any questions and to provide guidance on HUD policies and procedures.

Capital improvement projects are coordinated with CDBG coordinator to assure compliance with procurement standards and labor provisions. A pre-construction conference is held with the CDBG coordinator, subrecipient and contractors prior to starting on-site work to explain all applicable labor requirements and to discuss the responsibilities of each party. Each request for payment is reviewed by the CDBG Coordinator, City Clerk and Financial Analyst.

On-site monitoring visits may be conducted with subrecipients following completion of the project. Subrecipients are notified in writing in advance of the monitoring visit and are sent a written follow-up letter of any findings or recommendations. Monitoring visits focus on completeness of documentation, and administrative and financial management systems.

In addition, on-going monitoring is maintained with subrecipients, where necessary, to ensure compliance with relocation, acquisition and other long-term requirements.

#### Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

# Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.

In 2020, Naperville adopted a revised Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) in conjunction with the adoption of the CARES Act projects and spending priorities. The revised CPP addressed the COVID-19 pandemic by incorporating new procedures, flexibilities, suspensions and waivers allowed by HUD during the pandemic. These procedures included virtual public hearings and shortened public comment periods. Naperville's revised Citizen Participation Plan continues to require the City to "provide citizens, public agencies, and other interested parties with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports."

To ensure that citizens, public agencies and other interested parties have reasonable opportunity to examine the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER), the City takes the following actions upon completion of the draft report:

- 1) Publish a summary of the performance report as a display advertisement in the Naperville Sun newspaper. This ad will describe the performance report and specify where copies of the full report may be examined.
- 2) Ensure copies of the report are available at the 95th Street Library (3015 Cedar Glade Drive), Naper Boulevard Library (2035 S. Naper Boulevard), Nichols Library (200 W. Jefferson), City Clerk's Office at the Naperville Municipal Center (400 S. Eagle) and on the City of Naperville website (www.naperville.il.us/cdbg.aspx).

Once the report has been made available for comment, the City allows a 15-day period for citizens, public agencies and interested parties to respond (may be reduced to 5 days where emergency procedures apply). Comments may be submitted in writing to the CDBG coordinator as well as orally at a public hearing to be held at the conclusion of the public comment period. A summary of comments is attached to the final performance report.

For Program Year 2020, the public comment period and public hearing notice was published in the Naperville Sun on Sunday, May 30, 2021. The public comment period began on Tuesday, June 1, 2020 and will conclude on Wednesday, June 16, 2020. A public hearing on the CAPER will be held at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting at 7:00 p.m., June 15, 2020.
