### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this memorandum is to inform the City Council of the first 2024 community-wide diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI)-related event, taking place at 2 p.m. on Saturday, March 23, at the Madden Theater in Wentz Concert Hall.

### **BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:**

The second-year event series, Embracing Community: Empowering Our Dialogue, Deepening Our Understanding, is kicking off this month. As shared during the DEI update at the City Council meeting on December 19, 2023, the City plans a series of inclusive community conversations throughout 2024. The City is committed to partnering with organizations to engage the community and increase awareness and understanding to create an inclusive community that values diversity.

In recognition of Women's History Month and for the first 2024 inclusive conversation, the City and North Central College will co-host a panel discussion with several City of Naperville women, including the President of North Central College and other leaders within the Naperville community. Panelists will share insight through the lens of their unique experiences, followed by an interactive dialogue with attendees.
