


Welcome

Federal-aid Project Phases

Any transportation project involving the use of Federal funds must follow a project development process consisting of three phases.

Phase I includes extensive environmental and design studies to determine an improvement plan that will provide the desired level of safety and operation while considering social, economic, environmental, and cost factors. After a preliminary improvement plan is approved, Phase II Engineering (Contract Plans) and Right-of-Way Acquisition would begin. During this phase, detailed construction plans would be developed and any necessary land would be acquired for the project. Phase III is the physical construction of the project.

Although Phase I Engineering is being funded by the City of Naperville, it is anticipated that Federal funds will be used for construction of the project.
