State Aligns With New CDC Masking Guidance

State officials announced on Tuesday that they are fully aligned with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC's) new masking guidance, issued in response to the rapidly spreading Delta variant. In its guidance issued on Tuesday, July 27, the CDC advised that:

- Fully vaccinated people wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. Substantial transmission is defined as 50 to 99 cases per 100,000 people over a seven-day period. High transmission is defined as 100 cases per 100,000 people over a seven-day period. As of July 28, DuPage and Will Counties are currently categorized as substantial transmission risk.
- Fully vaccinated people might choose to wear a mask regardless of the level of transmission, particularly if they are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease from COVID-19. They might also choose to wear a mask if someone in their household is immunocompromised, at increased risk of severe disease or not fully vaccinated.
- Fully vaccinated people who have a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 be tested three to five days after exposure and wear a mask in public indoor settings for 14 days or until they receive a negative test result.
- Teachers, staff, students and visitors wear masks indoors at schools, regardless of vaccination status.

The City of Naperville encourages residents to consider getting vaccinated, if they are able. Data from the CDC shows that the Delta variant spreads twice as easily as previous strains, making vaccination even more important to stopping the spread of COVID-19. Vaccination also drastically reduces the threat of serious disease or death for individuals. Vaccines are widely available at retail pharmacies, through local physician offices and through the [DuPage County Health Department](#).
