Focused Priorities Supporting Fiscal Responsibility, Infrastructure and Community Safety

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Sustainable Public Pensions

- Protect pensions & taxpayers
- Require cost evaluation for all changes
- Link reform to documented problems

Protect Municipal Revenues

- Boost LGDF funding to reduce property tax burdens
- Increase state support for public safety & roadways

COMMUNITY PROTECTION

Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Privacy

- Prevent the monetization & commercial exploitation of police footage

Fiscal & Privacy Balance

- Safeguard citizen BWC dignity while reducing the FOIA compliance costs

Tougher Penalties for Fleeing

- Increase penalties for drivers who flee law enforcement

TRANSPORTATION

Regional Transit Reform

- Revise the People Over Parking Act to restore local authority to set minimum parking requirements
- Require SB2111 to have collar-county consensus on board decisions

Future Road Funding

- Evaluate solutions for declining Motor Fuel Tax revenue with new models

GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY


Modernize Public Notices and Maintain Transparency
