

NAPERVILLE E-BIKE RULES

What is an e-bike?

A bicycle with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts. Per state law, there are three classes of e-bikes, all of which are required to have a visible label displaying their class, motor wattage and top assisted speed.



AGE REQUIREMENT

16+

Generally allowed on:



- Bike Lanes
- Roadways
- Multi-use Paths
(Class 1 & Class 2 e-bikes only)
- Private Property
(with property owner's permission)

What's NOT an e-bike?

Dirt bikes and similar off-road vehicles, as well as any device with a motor over 750 watts, are NOT e-bikes and are not allowed on Naperville's public streets, bike lanes, sidewalks, and multi-use paths unless titled and registered as motor vehicles and operated pursuant to state law.

Generally NOT allowed on:



- Sidewalks
- Riverwalk

NAPERVILLE E-SCOOTER RULES

What is an e-scooter?

A device weighing less than 100 pounds, with 2 or 3 wheels, handlebars, and a floorboard that can be stood upon while riding, that is powered by a motor, and that is not capable of providing assistance when the device reaches 10 mph.



AGE REQUIREMENT

18+

Generally allowed on:



- Bike Lanes
- Roadways *(35 mph & under)*
- Multi-use Paths
- Private Property
(with property owner's permission)

Generally NOT allowed on:



- Sidewalks
- Roadways *(over 35 mph)*
- Riverwalk

Important note:

If a scooter has a motor capable of going faster than 10 mph, it is not allowed on Naperville's public streets, bike lanes, sidewalks, and multi-use paths.
