Since 1987, the Naperville Police Department has harnessed the creativity of Naperville's youngest citizens to produce the Naperville Crime Prevention Calendar. Our area elementary school students submit posters highlighting crime prevention issues and members of the Naperville Police Department review the submissions, selecting winners to be included in the calendar each year. As both a proud tradition and a treasured piece that has adorned the walls of Naperville homes for more than three decades, the Naperville Crime Prevention Calendar is a labor of love and a very special piece of work.
