City of Naperville Independence Day Closures

All non-emergency City offices will be closed on **Friday, July 3**, to observe Independence Day.

Curbside recycling/garbage collection will not be impacted. Electronics recycling at 156 Fort Hill Drive will be closed on **Friday, July 3**. The Recycling Drop-Off Center and the Household Hazardous Waste Facility, also located at 156 Fort Hill Drive, will be closed on **Saturday, July 4**.

E-Bike & E-Scooter Ordinance Now in Effect

A local ordinance regulating the use of electric bicycles (e-bikes), electric scooters (e-scooters), and other electric personal mobility devices in Naperville went into effect on Jan. 1.

Residents can visit naperville.il.us/ebikes to find a summary of the rules and a link to the full text of the ordinance. Residents are encouraged to read the ordinance in its entirety to determine which electric devices are permitted in town, where they can be operated and penalties for violating the ordinance.

Please be aware that e-bikes and e-scooters, as defined by the ordinance, are not permitted on any public sidewalk or the Riverwalk. Varying rules exist for bike lanes, roadways and multi-use paths depending on the type of electric device. Additionally, riders must be 16+ to operate an e-bike or 18+ to operate an e-scooter.

Water Main Replacement Projects

Several water main replacement projects are taking place over the summer, including work on large sections of Ogden Avenue and Washington Street. The City is replacing aging water mains to reduce water main breaks, increase water flow and service reliability, lower maintenance costs and extend the life of the system.

Impacts

- Motorists should expect lane closures and traffic pattern changes. Heed signage, allow for extra travel time and be careful when traveling in these areas.
- There may be occasional disruptions to water service. In these instances, crews will make every effort to notify residents proactively.

The Arbor Day Foundation named Naperville a 2025 Tree City USA for the 36th year to recognize its commitment to plant, grow and maintain trees. Naperville's Water Utility achieved Gold Level Water Ambassador status, the highest honor from the Illinois Section American Water Works Association (ISAWWA). The ISAWWA Water Ambassador Program was created to elevate public perception, knowledge and consumer education of the water industry. Gold Level Status is given to utilities that meet the state's highest standards for community engagement, industry transparency and public communication. Naperville's Fleet Services Division, which handles maintenance and repair for all City vehicles and equipment, has ranked sixth in "The 100 Best Fleets in the Americas" ranking by the National Association of Fleet Administrators (NAFA). Fleet Services has ranked in the top 100 for 13 consecutive years, and in the top 10 for the second straight year. Additionally, this is the first year that an individual from the Fleet Services team was recognized. Jordan Gilbert, a heavy equipment technician, ranked in the top five for NAFA's Fleet Technician of the Year.

Safer Naper: Domestic Violence Resources

The Naperville Police Department is committed to creating and fostering a departmental and community-wide understanding of the issues and dynamics surrounding domestic violence. If you feel that you might be a victim of domestic violence or would like more information for a loved one or friend, the resources provided in the police department's June Safer Naper campaign are available to offer support, information and guidance.

In 2025, the Naperville Police Department responded to more than 1,200 incidents of domestic trouble. More than one-third of those incidents involved physical contact.

Beware of Scams: Four Signs to Alert You

According to the Naperville Police Department, Naperville residents reported losing \$8.6 million to scams in 2025. Some of the most common scams residents fell victim to include:

- **Investment scams:** Someone promises a high return on an investment and may even pay out small returns to get the resident to invest more over time.
- **Law enforcement scams:** The resident is threatened with arrest for not paying an outstanding fine or is convinced a family member needs money for bail or some other legal reason.
- **False bank activity scams:** The resident is notified about fraudulent charges, accidental deposits, or suspicious bank activity and is convinced to transfer money or provide personal and/or financial information to secure their account.
- **Romance scams:** Someone the resident met online and thought they were in a relationship with gained their trust and convinced them to transfer large sums of money.
- **Social media marketplace scams:** Scammers pose as both fake sellers and fake buyers on online resale commerce platforms. They pretend to make payments, sell fake items, ask for deposits, and request personal information.

Scammers constantly change their tactics and look for new victims. Here are the four signs the Federal Trade Commission says can alert you to a scam:

1. Scammers **PRETEND** to be from an organization you know.
2. Scammers say there's a **PROBLEM** or a **PRIZE**.
3. Scammers **PRESSURE** you to act immediately.
4. Scammers tell you to **PAY** in a specific way.
