



City of Naperville COVID-19 Community Update 06/11/2021

Restrictions Lifted as State Enters Phase 5

State officials announced that as of today, Friday, June 11, 2021, the entire state has met the necessary metrics to move into Phase 5 of the Restore Illinois plan, a phase that allows a full reopening of all sectors of the economy without pandemic-related capacity limits. Entering this stage reflects progress in decreasing COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, while increasing the percentage of residents vaccinated across the state. All of Naperville – as well as all of Illinois – is now operating under Phase 5.

The following changes are effective immediately under Phase 5:

- All sectors of the economy can resume operations at regular capacity.
- People who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 – meaning 14 days has passed since their final dose of a two-shot vaccine or their only dose of a single-shot vaccine – can resume activities without wearing a mask, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal or territorial government or by local workplace or business regulations.
- Businesses no longer are required to implement mandatory social distancing in seated areas nor daily health screenings for employees and visitors.
 - However, businesses may choose to continue to put in place any public health mitigations they deem appropriate, including requiring masks or social distancing.

The following regulations remain in place under Phase 5, in accordance with guidelines issued by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention:

- The state continues to recommend mask-wearing by people who are not fully vaccinated.
- The state continues to recommend mask-wearing by anyone using public transportation; people inside transportation hubs, such as bus and train stations and airports; anyone in a congregate setting, such as a correctional facility, veterans' home, long-term care facility or group home; and anyone in a healthcare setting.
