Executive Order Extends Fire Inspection Deadlines for Multi-Family Residences

The Naperville City Council successfully held its first virtual meeting on Tuesday, April 7, allowing City officials to continue City operations during the COVID-19 pandemic. The meeting, which was held using Zoom, included discussion on establishing a municipal cannabis retailers' occupation tax, the rezoning of part of the Nokia property on Lucent Lane to residential and a bid approval for brush collection this spring, among other topics

Also on April 7, Mayor Steve Chirico signed an executive order amending the section of the Municipal Code that requires all multi-family buildings to have their fire alarm system inspected and tested annually by a certified technician.

Because the annual testing may take place within the living space of individual units where residents may be quarantined, this order grants a 90-day extension to complete testing if the building's inspection is required between April 7, 2020 and July 7, 2020. This extension does not apply to non-residential units. [Read the order](#).
