COVID-19 Community Update

Entering Phase 4

Today, the State of Illinois moves into Phase 4 of the Governor's Restore Illinois plan.

This phase includes the reopening of schools and child care programs, more non-essential businesses, restaurants for indoor dining, health clubs, movie theaters and other establishments with social distancing and safety measures in place. Mayor's Message to the Community

In today's [video message to the community](#), Mayor Chirico encourages residents to be diligent about safety precautions in the weeks and months ahead. The COVID-19 virus remains a significant concern throughout the state, and a sustained increase in positive tests or a significant outbreak could force a region to move back to a previous phase with tightened restrictions.

Guidelines regarding social distancing, occupancy limits and face coverings should be closely followed to prevent a resurgence of the virus. Additionally, residents are still encouraged to stay home when sick, practice social distancing and wash/sanitize their hands and frequently-touched surfaces regularly.

Municipal Center Procedures

At the Naperville Municipal Center, residents will no longer be asked to submit to a temperature check and health screening beginning Monday, June 29. However, visitors will still be asked to enter the building through the doors adjacent to the upper-level parking deck near the fountain, to wear a face covering and to use available hand sanitizer stations during their visit. The public may visit the Finance Department or the City Clerk's office. Other departments are available by appointment only. Meeting rooms remain closed to the public at this time.

Community members are encouraged to do business with the City online to the greatest extent possible while the COVID-19 pandemic continues. To keep the community and City staff safe, visits to the Municipal Center should be reserved for business that must be done in person. INDOOR DINING

- Restaurants and bars can offer indoor seating with capacity limits and safety measures in place



ENTERTAINMENT & RECREATION

- Movie theaters, health and fitness clubs, water parks, zoos, museums, and certain indoor recreation facilities (e.g. bowling alleys, skating rinks) reopen
- All outdoor activities allowed
- Capacity limits, safety measures in place



EDUCATION & CHILD CARE

- P-12 schools, higher education, all summer programs, child care allowed to open
- Safety measures in place

- ALL GATHERINGS OF 50 OR FEWER PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED ●
- BUSINESSES ALLOWED TO REOPEN WITH SAFETY MEASURES ●
