Executive Order 2020 – 09

## EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NAPERVILLE

### RECITALS

1. **WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak to be a public health emergency of international concern; and
2. **WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a proclamation on declaring a national emergency concerning the COVID-19 outbreak, and
3. **WHEREAS**, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued a disaster proclamation due to the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak and activated the State Emergency Operations Center, which has been re-declared or extended through at least May 29, 2020; and
4. **WHEREAS**, on March 16, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-07, suspending on-premise consumption of food and beverages in places of public accommodation and prohibiting gatherings of 50 people or more; and
5. **WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, at an emergency Naperville City Council meeting a local state of emergency and disaster related to the COVID-19 outbreak was declared and on April 21, 2020 at a Naperville City Council meeting the local state of emergency and disaster was extended (see, *Mayor of Naperville's Declaration of a Local State of Emergency and Disaster, City of Naperville Ordinance 20-028 pertaining to a local state of emergency and disaster, and City of Naperville Ordinance 20-040 pertaining to a local state of emergency and disaster*); and
6. **WHEREAS**, effective Wednesday, March 18, 2020, all City of Naperville buildings have been closed to the public and many City staff began working remotely impacting City public business operations; and
7. **WHEREAS**, on March 20, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-10, requiring that all non-essential business and operations cease and requiring all individuals currently living in the State of Illinois to stay at

- home or their place of residence except as necessary to perform essential activities; and
8. **WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-18, extending and continuing prior executive orders, including the order for residents to stay at home or their place of residence except as necessary to perform essential activities through April 30, 2020; and
  9. **WHEREAS**, on April 30, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-32, extending and continuing certain prior executive orders and permitting non-essential businesses to re-open for the limited purposes of fulfilling telephone and online orders through pick-up outside the store and delivery; and
  10. **WHEREAS**, hardships have been placed on businesses and residents because of the COVID-19 virus outbreak and the Governor of the State of Illinois' Executive Orders requiring operational modifications of Illinois businesses; and
  11. **WHEREAS**, vehicle parking within the Central Business District is provided through a shared system of parking spaces located on public streets and in parking lots and garages that are time-regulated to meet the needs of downtown patrons and businesses; and
  12. **WHEREAS**, the time regulations of certain spaces located on public streets within the Central Business District will limit the ability of businesses to fulfill orders through pick-up outside the store; and
  13. **WHEREAS**, the City of Naperville is a home rule unit of local government and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare, including taking immediate emergency measures to protect the public welfare in response to the COVID-19 outbreak; and

**THEREFORE**, by the powers vested in me as the Mayor of the City of Naperville, and pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 20 ILCS 3305/11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, Sections 10-1-1 and 1-8D of the Naperville Municipal Code, the Mayor of Naperville's Declaration of a Local State of Emergency and Disaster and City of Naperville Ordinances No. 20-028 and 20-040, I hereby order the following:

**SECTION 1: Recitals.** The Recitals set forth above are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made part hereof in their entirety by reference as though fully set forth in this Section 1.

**SECTION 2: Central Business District On-street Parking.** Section 11-2A-3:1 and 11-2A-3:2 of the Naperville Municipal Code are amended, until such a date as later determined, in writing, by the City, such that no person shall park a vehicle on the following streets in the Central Business District for more than thirty minutes, unless otherwise limited by signs posted: Chicago Avenue from Main Street to Washington Street, Jackson Avenue from Webster Street to Washington Street, Jefferson Avenue from Webster Street to Ellsworth Street, Main Street from Benton Avenue to Jackson Avenue, Van Buren Avenue from Webster Street to Washington Street, Water Street from Webster Street to Main Street and Webster Street from Benton Avenue to Jackson Avenue. The regulation shall be in full force and effect between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m. and nine o'clock (9:00) p.m., seven days per week.

**SECTION 3: Savings clause.** If any provisions of this Executive Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, this invalidity or unenforceability does not affect any other provisions or application of this Executive Order, which can be given effect without the invalid or unenforceable provision or application. To achieve this purpose, the provisions of the Executive Order are declared to be severable.

**SECTION 4: Effective date.** This Executive Order shall be in full force and effect from 12:00 A.M. on May 5, 2020 atop page one of this Order.
