Naperville has owned its Electric Utility since 1899, celebrating 120+ years of reliability and continuous improvement, bringing power to more than 60,000 customers each month.

Features of your locally-controlled utility:

96 million
kilowatt hours of electricity were purchased in May 2020.

Naperville buys its electricity through the Illinois Municipal Electric Agency (IMEA).

94% of Naperville's electric infrastructure is underground.

This increases reliability because it is less prone to weather and other damage versus overhead.

Naperville residents enjoy competitive electric rates.

Naperville's Electric Utility is at the forefront of new technologies designed to keep the power on and to respond to outages more quickly.



Shedding some light on reliability

Naperville recorded 29 outages from April to June 2020. The breakdown of causes are:

TOTAL MILES OF ELECTRICAL CABLE


1,269 miles

Underground


1,166 miles
